

# Nebraska Association of County Officials Legislative Report



February 15, 2008

## Registration Retention and Lien Notation Bills Amended into LB 756

Although it has not been officially reported, a bill updating references to federal motor carrier law, **LB 756**, will serve as the base for a number of issues heard by the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee, including two measures introduced at NACO's request. **LB 827** would allow county treasurers to dispose of paper copies of motor vehicle registrations after three years, rather than six years. Electronic registration records would still be maintained by the Department of Motor Vehicles. **LB 834** would clarify that loan documents do not need to be provided when a title with a lien noted on it is brought into Nebraska from another state.

Other bills amended into LB 756 include **LB 712**, which exempts automatic daytime running lights from state prohibitions against driving with parking lights on, and **LB 841**,

which authorizes the use of an attachment when additional dealer reassignments are needed. **LB 874** would rephrase references to rubber-tired cranes with fixed loads so that annual permits could be issued for these and certain other vehicles. **LB 917** would allow certain vehicles to carry additional weight if they employ idle reduction technology. **LB 919** would address the timing of registration fee refunds for apportioned vehicles and **LB 1087** would remove a requirement for motor vehicle and trailer dealers to carry a certificate of title with vehicles and trailers that are for sale.

The Transportation Committee selected LB 756 and LB 755 as priority bills.

## Snapshots of County Issues

- Governing bodies could not require a member of the public to make a request prior to the meeting to be placed on the agenda in order to comment on an **agenda item** under **LB 962**, which was sent to the floor by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
- The fixed portion of the state's **gas tax** would be reduced to offset new wholesale fuel taxes if **LB 846** is adopted. The bill was advanced to General File by the Revenue Committee.
- Commissions and other issues related to collecting **occupation taxes** on irrigated acres were discussed during a Natural Resources Committee hearing on Wednesday. **LB 1131** would clearly authorize counties to collect a commission on occupation tax collections identical to that collected for other natural resources district (NRD) taxes. **LB 1132** would require the tax and collection process to be conducted "in the same manner" as other taxes. An amendment was offered to require county treasurers to provide data about delinquent occupation taxes to NRDs including the owner, parcel identification number, and the delinquent amount. The bills were combined and advanced to General File as LB 1131.
- Governor Heineman signed a series of bills adopted last week. **LB 312** allows **recall elections** to be cancelled if the subject of the recall resigns at least 16 days prior to the election. In

addition, the bill requires resignations from elective office to be made in writing. **LB 269** standardizes petition signature requirements for several processes including changing the number of county commissioners and discontinuing the **township form of government**. The bill contains provisions from **LB 348** that eliminate and revise conflicting statutes pertaining to changing from a township form to a commissioner form of government.

- **Jurors** in civil and criminal trials could take notes during the trial and refer to them during deliberations if **LB 804** is adopted. The bill was advanced to General File from the Judiciary Committee.
- Counties and other governmental entities using **energy financing contracts** to install solar, thermal and other energy conservation measures could enter into agreements for 30 years, rather than 15 years, under **LB 747**, which was advanced from General File.
- In order to comply with federal requirements, the Secretary of State's office would be designated as a **voter registration** agency by **LB 750**. If more than 100 vacancies occur in the House of Representatives and special elections are required, the governor would specify an election date under **LB 856**. Both bills were advanced to Select File.
